## Sar-El: Experiencing Israel in a Different Way

**Discussion: Contributing to the Well-Being of Israel** 

Sar-El, The National Project for Volunteers for Israel—or Service for Israel—is a non-profit service organization for Israeli citizens living abroad who wish to finalize their status with the military. The program is also open to non-Israeli citizens who would like to participate in a program akin to national service without enlisting in the IDF, the Israeli military Defense Force. In November 2015, Temple Beth Hillel member, David A. Brown, fulfilled a long-held desire to contribute to the well-being of Israel with his hands. He connected with volunteers throughout the world on a Sar-El mission. Stationed on IDF bases in Israel, David lived in a barracks, dined in the mess hall with soldiers, and performed non-combative duties: packing medical supplies and food, repairing machinery, organizing equipment, building fortifications, and maintaining the bases.
