Shana Tova! This year, Temple Beth Hillel's High Holy Days will be entirely online. They will not be in person, **but they will be real!** Our volunteer leadership is working with Cantor Shayndel and Rabbi Dean to create a rich experience. Services will be shorter, different, profound and meaningful. We will be worshipping together online, as a community.

In addition to these "synchronous" services, we will be providing a series of asynchronous events, study sessions, recordings of songs, videos of drashot and the Torah service, memories and reflections by congregants and clergy, to ensure that the coming Days of Awe are a profound and special time. We look forward to worshipping together and being in community with you.

High Holy Days in A Box

To build a sense of connection and community we will be providing every member household with a "High Holy Days in a Box." The box will contain many of the necessities for the Days of Awe: holiday candles, a yizkor candle, kosher grape juice for kiddush, and some honey (you provide the apples). We will use many of these items together during the service as a way we can all be together, while we are physically distanced. We will also be including copies of the High Holy Day Machzorim, but they will have to be returned to the synagogue after the High Holy Days.
